An Interactive Residential Course

The Society of Cosmetic Scientists has been the leading authority in the organisation and carrying out of scientific educational programmes in the many fields of cosmetic science and at all levels

The most prestigious of these is the week long residential Principles & Practice Course in Cosmetic Science, which has been in existence for over 30 years. The course has been constantly updated to maintain its pre-eminent position. It is renowned worldwide as an arduous but rewarding immersion in cosmetic science and participation in group projects.

The course is particularly suitable for scientists who have been working in the Cosmetics Industry and the allied supply and support industries for a few years and are looking to move in to more managerial or supervisory roles, primarily, but not exclusively, in the scientific functions. It is also suitable for the more mature manager requiring updated information on the technologies associated with the development of personal care products or sudden and speedy immersion into a new field of expertise. The minimum educational requirement for the course is degree-level, preferably in a science subject, although other qualifications/experience may be considered.

With the requirements of all types of participants firmly borne in mind, the course consists of a wide range of formal lectures, with ample time for question and answer sessions. These lectures are given by eminent practising cosmetic scientists and academics, many of who are recognised internationally within the industry as experts in their field.

The course members also participate in a challenging product development exercise. The exercise is carried out by competitive groups of students, is computer controlled and designed to encourage the practical application of the science and formulation principles covered by the lectures. The lectures on any given day will provide information relevant to the evening's work on the exercise. Additionally, some relevant managerial skills will also be provided, such as, team working

and project management. The objective is to maximise the learning experience of the participants. The exercise, which takes place in the evenings during the whole week, comes to a climax in the form of presentations given by each group to guest judges playing the roles of "Managing Director" and "Marketing Director".

Competitive groups of the course participants are also given a practical 'hands-on' opportunity to compound a perfume following their theoretical session on perfumery.

The fees for the course are inclusive of all meals and overnight accommodation. The course commences on Sunday afternoon with an Inaugural Lecture by the Course Administrators at 15.00 hours. It concludes at 13.00 on Friday. Lunch and overnight accommodation on Friday can be provided as optional extras.

Cancellation/Substitution Policy: Cancellation of a confirmed Registration is required **in writing** to the Society's Office. Fees will be refunded according to the date of receipt of this written cancellation by the office as follows:-
